Parents often ask how they can help their child's learning and development. Here are a few tips we find helpful (taken from [www.early-education.org.uk](http://www.early-education.org.uk))

- Try to see things from your child's point of view – understanding how children see the world will help you to help them as they learn
- Let children be children – a skilled 5 year old grows from a busy 4 year old, a curious 3 year old, a cuddled 2 year old, an adventurous 1 year old and a communicative baby
- Be a playful companion – you can enjoy childhood with the children as well
- Feelings matter – both the children's emotions and your own are part of any situation with young children. It is very helpful to be aware of your own mood and theirs when enjoying yourself with them and during difficult moments
- Don't expect to be perfect – Everyone does something they don't mean sometimes. Children can be forgiving as long as we are thoughtful most of the time and are ready to say sorry when we should

Listening to children, reading with them, going for a walk, sharing the jobs, playing outdoors pretending, having a giggle are all rich learning opportunities.



**LIBRARY DAYS** – We know that the love of books is vital in helping children to develop into competent readers. In order to support this we have a library system available within nursery. Each family group will have a day when they can choose and change their library books. Please return your child's book on that day each week. Look out for the guidance sheets about how to share books with your child.

**RHYMES and STORIES**– We shall be giving each child a set of rhymes which we are using in nursery that you can share with them. Learning rhymes significantly helps children develop their language, counting and memory skills. We shall send a new set home each half term. If you have special family rhymes you share with your child please let us know too and then we can share these with the other children. In nursery we will be sharing familiar fairy stories – particularly Goldilocks, Three Little Pigs and Three Billy Goats Gruff. Perhaps you could share them at home too.

**PARKING** – The car park can get very busy. Please be kind and considerate with each other for the children’s sake. For health and safety reasons please park in the designated spaces only. If walking to the nursery please ensure that you use the pathway away from the cars and hold your child’s hand at all times.
