

Admissions Policy

Aim

The aim of Windsor Nursery School admission policy is to ensure that our service is accessible to all children and families in the area, in line with our single equality policy.

All parents/ carers will be welcomed and shown around the school. There will be opportunities to ask questions and to share information about the school and its ethos, values and vision.

Maintained nursery school

The school provides:

- Nursery education for 3 & 4 year old children
- Terrific for 2's
- *Inclusion Provision for complex SEND, 10 dedicated places – service commissioned by LA and admission arrangements are allocated through the Special Needs Early Years' Service policies and procedures – City of Wolverhampton Council*

Nursery Education (3-4's) – universal entitlement

All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to receive free part time nursery education during school term time. Children are normally admitted to the nursery school in the term following their third birthday in date of birth order. Length of time on the waiting list does not govern admission.

If there are more children than there are places available, applications will be considered in accordance with the following criteria:-

- 'Looked after' children in the care of the Local Authority
- Children placed on the Child Protection register
- Children identified as a 'Child in Need'
- Children with special educational needs or disabilities
- A child with a sibling already attending the setting
- When places become available mid school year (eg January or April) these will be offered to current Terrific for 2's at Windsor whose funding comes to an end (who have reached their 3rd birthday) in order to provide continuity for these children and families.

Parents/carers will be offered a place by letter and must confirm their acceptance by the designated date (usually two weeks).

The admission arrangements for the 3&4yr old children are managed by the Deputy Headteacher.

There is no current provision of the 30hr extended offer at Windsor Nursery School.

Terrific for Two's (2's – 3's)

15 hours free 2s nursery during term-time is available for 2 year olds if parents/carers claim one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Tax Credits with an annual household income of under £16,190 before tax
- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credits (from April 1st 2018), if entitled to Universal Credits you must have an annual net earned income equivalent to and not exceeding £15,400 assessed on up to three most recent Universal Credits assessment periods
- If your child has a statement of Special Education Needs
- If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- If your child is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance
- If the child is looked after by the local authority
- If the child is no longer looked after by the local authority as a result of an adoption order, a special guardianship order or child arrangement order

Terrific for Twos funding starts the term after a child's 2nd birthday:

If your child's birthday is between:	Funding starts from:
1 st January and 31 st March	April
1 st April & 31 st August	September
1 st September & 31 st December	January

How to claim Terrific for Twos

Parents can claim for 15 hours free childcare by applying online at www.wolverhampton.gov.uk/terrificfortwos. The City of Wolverhampton Council will then provide confirmation to the parent of eligibility. Parents can then bring this evidence (voucher number) to Windsor. The school will inform the parent when a place becomes available. Places at Windsor within the terrific for two's are offered term time only.

If there are more children eligible for a place than there are places available applications will be considered in accordance with the following criteria:-

- 'Looked after' children in the care of the Local Authority
- Children placed on the Child Protection register
- Children identified as a 'Child in Need'

- Children with special educational needs or disabilities
- A child with a sibling already attending the setting

The admission arrangements for the Terrific for Two's children is managed by the Terrific for Twos Coordinator.

When funding ceases for children within the Terrific for Two's the school will endeavour to offer 3-4's nursery places at Windsor for continuity however this will be dependent on demand and should the nursery be oversubscribed the normal criteria will be applied to allocate places.

Staff members are encouraged to consider alternative provision for their children. In exceptional circumstances places for children of staff employed within the school will be considered within the criteria above. The staff member will be required to meet with the Headteacher before any place is offered to discuss the implications on his/her role with the school, the team and their child.
